National CASA Conference:

A Better Life for EVERY CHLD!

National CASA Conference is held annually, but this year we were lucky enough that it came to us! The 2014 National Conference was held in Grapevine, Texas and our National Association did an excellent job of locating very interesting, inspiring and informative speakers for this event! This year, we were fortunate enough to send 4 staff members to the National Conference and what a learning experience it was! The conference theme was "A Better Life for EVERY child" and the workshops helped us learn how to make a "better life" for all of our CASA kids. Workshop trainings that we were able to attend included topics such as working with traumatized children; advocating for permanency; equipping and engaging advocates to promote awareness about issues our CASA kids face; growing our CASA program; and maintaining perspective while working very challenging cases. The highlight of the conference was listening to several former CASA youth share their story about the challenges that they have faced in life and how their advocates helped them to rise above those challenges to become successful members of today's society! Ashley Rhodes-Courter, a former CASA kid and author of the book "Three Little Words" was one of these presenters. She wowed the audience with her inspirational story, a story that spreads hope for children in foster care and a story that exemplifies what CASA is all about. Her story included her thoughts about how she might have lingered in the Florida foster care system, had it not been for her CASA volunteer. Ashley credits her advocate volunteer, in a large part, to challenging the foster care system and relentlessly advocating for Ashley's placement with an adoptive family. Ashley was successfully adopted by a loving family because of what her CASA volunteer did! How is that for inspiration?!?!?! If you are interested in reading her book, we have it in our CASA library at the office. You can come and borrow it any time!

Volunteer Spotlight

Meet our Rookie of the Year, Paula McGregor!!!!!

Paula has served a total of 13 children through our CASA program since she began volunteering just 10 months ago! She is a trooper and a TRUE Rookie of the Year!

Paula says that since becoming a volunteer advocate through CASA, she has been most surprised by the volume of cases in this area and the numbers of children that we serve!

Some little known tidbits about Paula after a personal tragedy, she became a Peer Mentor for the TAPS grief program --- just another way that she gives back!!! She is a mother of 3 - ages 27, 24 and 15. Paula is a self-proclaimed "military brat" and she attended high school while in Germany. She is a cattle rancher, property manager and grandmother, as well. She loves to cook and she and her husband teach CHL classes!
